MAN RAY, BORN MANUEL RADNITSKY IN PHILADELPHIA, WAS CHAMPIONED ALTERNATELY AS A DADAIST AND A SURREALIST. HIS CAREER UNDERWENT NUMEROUS RENEWALS DURING HIS LIFETIME. AND, HIS WORK CONTINUES TO LIVE ON INTO THE TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY AS A VITAL FORCE INFLUENCING YOUNG ARTISTS AROUND THE WORLD.

MAN RAY, SURREALISM'S DESIRING EYE NON PLUS ULTRA, ACHIEVED IN HIS MOST ACCOMPLISHED WORKS, THAT POISE OF IMMANENCE, ON THE NEAR SIDE OF PASSION, WHICH IS THE EROTIC SWEAT. BUT HIS PHOTOGRAPHIC SUBJECTS ALSO INCLUDED SUCH PERSONALITIES AS ERNEST HEMINGWAY, A WRITER OF FICTION, WHOSE CONCISE PROSE BROKE SHARPLY FROM THAT GAME OF PROLONGMENT SO FAVORED BY THE EUROPEAN SOPHISTICATES OF THAT DAY.
